The winning scheme by Mayslits Kassif Architects organized the compound's buildings, including an auditorium, gymnasium, residential tower, and education wing, around a public space which serves as the vital hub of the complex.

The first building that was erected in the complex is The Mina & Everard Goodman Educational Campus & Municipal Offices. The 100m long horizontal, serene structure of the education wing is juxtaposed with the lightly sloped site, enabling differentiation of scale and a series of terraced spaces accompanying the long building.

The dense plot and the tight public budget posed a challenge and led to a search for a feasible, yet inspiring, design. The kindergarten classrooms are, therefore, built on two levels that implement compact land use which creates an urban version of the familiar childcare

A unique woven timber fabric separates the public space from the children's realm, creating a light filter and playful articulation of horizontal and linear space. This handcrafted system acts as a contemporary variation of the Tel-Avivian brise-soleil architectural tradition, which provides solar protection while enabling air flow through the façade.
